





## 1.4 Getting Started

#### 1.4.1 Installing the Battery

Turn the switch left to lock the battery cover.
 Turn the switch up to unlock the battery cover.



2. You can take the battery out directly.



NOTE: Please make sure the battery cover is securely closed, or you may be unable to turn ON the terminal.

WARNING! There is a risk of fire and burns if the battery pack is handled improperly.

DO NOT disassemble, crush, puncture, short external contacts, or dispose the battery pack in fire or water. DO NOT attempt to open or service the battery pack.

Dispose of used batteries according to local recycling guidelines in your area.





### 1.4.2 Charging the Battery

Before you turn on and start using this device, it is recommended that you charge the battery.

If the battery has been discharged for several days, you may need to charge for several minutes before powering it on.


Use only the adapter and the USB cable that came with this device to charge the battery. When the battery power is too low, make sure to use the power adapter or put into the cradle to charge.

NOTE!!: For first use, you must charge, at least for 3 seconds, the battery in the HT1.

#### Charge with USB

Connect the micro USB cable to the USB port at the bottom of HT1 and plug into your PC's USB port to simultaneously charge the HT1. Or plug the AC power adapter into the electrical outlet on the USB plug.


Note: AC power adapter is included in the package without cradle.





#### ■ Charge with cradle (Highly recommended)

- Plug the AC adapter cable into the power jack on the cradle, and then connect the AC adapter into an electrical outlet.
- Slide the device into the cradle until it clicks in place.







## 1.4.3 Turning on the terminal for the first time

After you have initially charged your device for about 24 hours, the device is ready to be used. You can now start up your device. You can then set up the languages, WiFi setting, and date and time.

Press the key once, it will appear a blue symbol in the status bar at the top of the screen. Then you can refer to the following table to execute the desired function or input. Please refer to 1.5.1 Using Function keys.










# 2.3 PC Setting

## 2.5 Launcher Introduction

HT1 Launcher defaults display all applications installed in the device.

Depends on users' preference, HT1 launcher also allows you to customize the setting, such as one app only, different list of apps, pin code access, or the look and feel change. Each change must have a corresponding file and store into HT1 Download folder. The following files inside the Download folder are used to customize the HT1 Launcher:

■ Launcher Mode: Kiosk Mode or Launcher Mode (File name: KioskApp.txt or LauncherApp.txt)

#### 2.5.1 Kiosk App Mode

When HT1 Launcher is configured in Kiosk Mode, the device will boot up into the application specified in the KioskApp.txt file. To setup HT1 Launcher in Kiosk Mode, please follow the instructions below:

- 1. Please create a text file on your pc. (file name: KioskApp.txt)
- 2. Input command in the text file:

```
packageName=<Kiosk App Package Name>
ex. calculator : packageName=com.android.calculator2
```

- 3. Save KioskApp.txt to HT1 Download folder.
- 4. Please restart HT1 to switch to Kiosk App mode.

Note: If both KioskApp.txt and LauncherApp.txt store in the HT1 Download folder, HT1



HT1 User's Manual

will only recognize KioskApp.txt.





#### 2.5.2 Launcher App Mode

The factory default of HT1 is to boot into the Launcher Mode and show all installed apps in the device. If you wish to customize apps based on your own preference, please follow the instructions below to setup the Launcher Mode app list:

- 1. Please create a text file on your pc. (file name: LauncherApp.txt)
- 2. Input app names in the text file, and one app name per line.

Ex.


If HT1 displays information in another language, app names need to use the same language in the text file.

- 3. Save LauncherApp.txt to HT1 Download folder.
- 4. Please restart HT1 to switch to Launcher App mode.





## 2.5.3 Font color and Background Color



1. Please create a text file on your pc.

( file name :FontColor.txt and BackgroundColor.txt)

2. Input \( \tau \) # + Android color code (#AARRGGBB) \( \tau \) in the text file.

Ex.

Yellow: #FFFFF00 White: #FFFFFFF Maroon: #FF800000 Cream: #FFFFDD0

Note: First 2 digits of color code are transparency values, FF being 100% opaque, and 00 being 100% transparent.

- 3. Save FontColor.txt or BackgroundColor.txt to HT1 Download folder.
- 4. Please restart HT1 to get the new font color or background color.





#### 2.5.4 Pincode in Launcher Mode

HT1 Launcher offers three functions when users press the menu key: reboot, settings, and apps. By factory default, users can access these three functions without any restrictions. However, HT1 Launcher can require users to input a pincode before allowing them to execute those menu functions.

To setup the pincode, please follow the instructions below:

- 1. Please create a text file on your pc. (file name: Pincode.txt)
- 2. Input a set of Pincode in the text file.
- 3. Save Pincode.txt to HT1 Download folder.

#### 2.5.5 Wallpaper in Launcher Mode

HT1 Launcher has its own built-in wallpaper by factory default.

To customize a wallpaper, please add or replace the Wallpaper.png file in the Download folder:


- 1. Save a Wallpaper.png to HT1 Download folder.

## 2.6 Programmable Keys


The HT1's keys can be programmed for users to be able to perform different functions or applications.


## 3.5 MoboLink

1. Go to MoboLink, press ENT key.






